

# 7<sup>th</sup> Retreat of CRC TRR 190 Berlin, Schwanenwerder April 20-22, 2020

# **Invitation and Call for Papers**

We invite all members of the CRC TRR 190 to register for the retreat. The retreat will have an unusual format because it is also the **rehearsal for the evaluation visit** that will take place on May 14-15. It is therefore important that each project is well represented – we will surely deliver a strong performance at the evaluation visit but it is important to practice it beforehand – and to enjoy each other's company, anyway.

As usual, we will have **individual presentations** and discussions at the retreat. We plan a somewhat smaller number of presentations, but please do send us your work for inclusion in the program. Most likely, we will be able to find a time slot.

In addition to the individual presentations, we will have one slot with a **poster session**, rehearsing for the evaluation visit, as detailed below. In addition, we will spend the morning hours of Tuesday April 21 to rehearse and work on the **overview presentations** to be held at the evaluation visit.

So altogether, each project should be represented by (i) a PI, (ii) a team member who presents the poster (this should be a team member whose name appears in the proposal), and at least one team member or PI who presents a paper. As always, the more the merrier.

#### **Posters**

We ask that **each project** (including INF and Z) to please prepare a poster that (i) summarizes the past work of the project and (ii) gives an overview of the planned work during the second funding period (in each case, where applicable). Together with this call for papers, you will receive a template for such a poster. Please find it in the attachment.

The content of the poster, and other information about the project, will be presented by team members of the project - **not only the PIs**. We will later send more instructions, and are looking forward to discussions about how to use the posters most effectively.

We will also be in touch regarding the technical aspects of transporting and presenting the posters in Schwanenwerder.

The **posters will be refereed** by an internal process within the CRC. We will soon send the allocation of referees, and the corresponding (simple) procedures.



### Time and Place

The retreat takes place from Monday, April 20 (arrival at 18:00, before dinner) to Wednesday, April 22, 2020 (departure after or before lunch at 13:00). The Young Researcher's Workshop starts on Monday, April 20, at 15:00. Conference venue is, as usual, the "Evangelische Bildungsstätte auf Schwanenwerder" in Berlin.
