We are organizing a **Workshop on Cognitive Economics**. The event will take place in Herrsching am Ammersee, on 24-25 August 2026.

The workshop builds on previous successful editions (2021–2025) and aims to bring together researchers working on beliefs, memory, narratives, information acquisition and related topics in behavioral and experimental economics. The event consists of a two-day research workshop featuring presentations of current work related to the topics below, as well as a poster session and a half day mini-course for PhD students.

On top of the research presentations, we will set aside time for informal conversations to create opportunities for the discussion of broader topics and brainstorming about potential future research avenues.

Topics

We invite submissions on topics related to:

- Belief formation and updating
- Memory
- Narratives and mental models
- Information acquisition
- Dynamic decision-making

Both theoretical and empirical contributions are welcome.

Submissions

Interested authors should submit a full paper or extended abstract.

PhD students are warmly encouraged to apply. When completing the submission form, PhD candidates should state whether they would like to be considered for a presentation in the main workshop, for the poster session, or both.

In the absence of a full paper or extended abstract, PhD applicants can apply to attend the workshop (without presenting) by submitting a letter of motivation. In addition, they should ask a reference to send a letter of support to **cog.econ.workshop.2026@gmail.com**.
